Property Rights

 - Change X
 - Destroy X

Libertarianism

Libertarianism is generally associated with three claims:

1. All rights are property rights
2. We have the greatest possible extent of property rights over our own body (as well as talents and labour)
3. If we acquire land or resources in the state of nature, we have the greatest possible extent of property rights over them
